Use of Sports Premium in 2015/2016

The Government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, will be allocated to primary school headteachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

How We Intend to Use Our Sports Premium Allocation £9,200 in 2015/16

- Work with Aspire to further develop the teaching and learning of PE
- Provide bespoke coaching and mentoring for staff
- Appoint a 'Sports Champion' in order to enhance playground games at break and lunchtimes
- Offer after school clubs that enable pupils to utilise a range of skills and establish participation habits
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- Develop 'Pupil Leaders of Sport' in order to increase the enjoyment of sport throughout the school as well as develop key leadership skills.

The Intended Impact of Our Sports Premium Allocation £9,200 in 2015/16

- To achieve the Silver Sports Mark
- Enable the children to participate in a range of active and purposeful playground activities
- Leaders of PE will undertake professional development opportunities in accreditation modules
- Develop Pupil Leaders of Sport so that children are able to plan, organise and deliver sporting activities at lunchtime and help to run after school clubs.
- This is one way in which we seek to encourage early adoption of sport and exercise to **help improve the lifestyle** of pupils and **build an appreciation** of the benefits of regular exercise that will remain into and throughout adulthood
